We looked through the documents you sent us. A few items appear worth checking before anything is filed or signed, so we listed them below in the order that may be most helpful.

Here are the items that may be worth checking before the documents are filed or signed:

1. The client address appears as [REDACTED] on the signed third-party declaration, while the current FL-140, FL-141, FL-165, FL-170, FL-180, and FL-190 use [REDACTED]. Please check the intended street number and make the current packet consistent.
2. The signed third-party declaration shows preparer contact information at Suite 347 and (661) 489-3369, while several current forms show Suite 351 and (661) 873-4423. One Word draft also shows a different telephone number and earlier registration expiration date. Please check which preparer information is current.
3. Several versions of the third-party declaration appear in the packet. One is signed and dated April 30, 2026; one Word copy is unsigned; and another Word copy lists earlier petition-stage documents and leaves the case number, date, and signature incomplete. Please confirm which version is intended for current use.
4. The third-party declaration heading 'INPROPRIA PERSONA' appears as one word. The spacing may be worth checking for professional presentation.
5. The third-party declaration describes FL-180 as 'Judgment with Stipulation and Order,' while the current FL-170 is marked 'Default without agreement' and FL-180 is titled Judgment or Proposed Judgment. The document description may be worth making consistent.
6. On FL-141, item 4 appears to select the respondent's preliminary disclosure and current income and expense declaration as waived, while the checked explanation refers to waiver of the final disclosure. Please check whether the boxes and explanation are intended to refer to the same item.
7. On FL-150, page 1 identifies [REDACTED] as the current employer, but the attached earnings statements identify [REDACTED]. No current 'Question 1-Other Jobs' attachment appears in the packet. Please check whether the employer entries and supporting pay statements describe one job or more than one job.
8. On FL-150, page 3, the listed monthly expenses appear to total [REDACTED], while total expenses are shown as [REDACTED]. The arithmetic may need to be checked.
9. Two FL-180 versions appear in the uploaded materials: one labeled 'PROPOSED JUDGMENT' and one labeled 'JUDGMENT.' Please confirm which copy belongs in the current filing set.
10. On FL-180, page 2, the 'Number of pages attached' line appears blank even though the two-page FL-345 is included. The page-count entry may be worth checking.

11. On FL-345, page 1, the same [REDACTED] account ending in [REDACTED] appears under both parties at [REDACTED] each. The earlier property declaration appears to show [REDACTED] total and [REDACTED] proposed to each party. The wording may be clearer if each entry expressly reflects the intended share of the same account.

12. On FL-345, pages 1 and 2, the same [REDACTED] mortgage appears under both parties at [REDACTED] each, with language that each person is solely responsible for the listed debt. The earlier property declaration appears to show [REDACTED] total and [REDACTED] proposed to each party. Please check whether the wording clearly describes the intended split or responsibility.

13. The compensation sentence in the third-party declaration says in substance that the amount of compensation 'were [REDACTED] fees.' The grammar may be worth revising so the sentence reads smoothly.

██████ v. ██████ - Checklist

- ☐ Check the client's street number across the third-party declaration and current forms.
- ☐ Check which preparer suite number, telephone number, and registration information are current.
- ☐ Confirm which third-party declaration is the current version and keep obsolete or incomplete copies out of the current set if appropriate.
- ☐ Check the spacing of 'INPROPRIA PERSONA' in the third-party declaration heading.
- ☐ Check whether the FL-180 description in the third-party declaration should match the title used in the current judgment packet.
- ☐ Check the FL-141 item 4 boxes and waiver explanation so they refer to the same disclosure item.
- ☐ Check the FL-150 employer entry, supporting pay statements, and any needed other-jobs attachment for consistency.
- ☐ Recheck the FL-150 monthly expense total.
- ☐ Confirm which FL-180 version is intended for the current filing set.
- ☐ Check the FL-180 attached-page count.
- ☐ Check the FL-345 bank-account wording so each ██████ entry clearly describes the intended share of the same account.
- ☐ Check the FL-345 mortgage wording so each ██████ entry clearly describes the intended split or responsibility.
- ☐ Revise the compensation sentence in the third-party declaration if needed for grammar.
