Dear Ramandeep Kaur [REDACTED],

We looked through the documents you sent us. A few items appear worth checking before anything is filed or signed, so we listed them below in the order that may be most helpful.

Here are the items that may be worth checking before the documents are filed or signed:

1. One uploaded third-party declaration appears to belong to a different dissolution case and uses entirely different party names, address information, and document descriptions. Two real-property questionnaire files also appear to concern a different estate or appraisal matter. These materials may have been included accidentally, and the packet may be clearer if they are separated from this case before filing, signing, or service.
2. The two-page third-party declaration for this case appears to leave the case-number field blank, while the rescheduling declaration and the court-filed documents use case number [REDACTED]. Please check whether the case number should be added before that declaration is signed or used.
3. The two-page third-party declaration appears to list the preparer's registration expiration as 01/21/2026, while the rescheduling declaration and later packet materials appear to show 01/21/2028. The dates may reflect different versions, but the intended expiration date may be worth checking for consistency.
4. The preparer contact information appears to vary across the packet. One third-party declaration uses telephone number (661) 489-3369, the rescheduling declaration uses (661) 587-8423, and later filed forms show another Bakersfield Paralegal telephone number. Please check which contact information is intended for any document that will be newly signed or filed.
5. Both third-party declarations appear to say that the amount of compensation paid for the preparation and filing of the documents "were \$870.00," followed by wording that the fees were for document preparation only. The sentence may be clearer if the singular amount uses "was," and the wording about "preparation and filing" versus "preparation only" may be worth making internally consistent.
6. The rescheduling third-party declaration appears to have a blank date and no visible signature in the copy reviewed. If it is intended as a pre-signature draft, this may be expected, but please check that the final version contains the intended date and signature before it is used.

- ☐ Remove or separate the unrelated dissolution declaration and real-property questionnaire materials from this case packet.
- ☐ Add or confirm case number ■■■■ on the two-page third-party declaration.
- ☐ Check whether the preparer's registration expiration should read 01/21/2028 rather than 01/21/2026.
- ☐ Check which preparer telephone number should be used consistently on newly prepared documents.
- ☐ Make the compensation sentence grammatically and internally consistent if the declarations will be revised.
- ☐ Check that the final rescheduling third-party declaration contains the intended date and signature.
